## CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF STUDENTS PARTICPATING ABOVE THEIR AGE GROUPING

## Major Carnivals – Golf, Swimming, Cross Country, Athletics and Tennis

### 1. Rationale and Eligibility Criteria:

- **1.1** Students may compete above their age grouping in Major Carnivals to fill a full team complement. Students who compete above their age grouping, must be physical able to be competitive in this age group. Students who compete above their grouping must remain in this age grouping for the entire Carnival.
- **1.2** Where carnivals take place across two or more days; students can only participate in ONE age group.
- **1.3** Student must be currently enrolled in the SACCSS member College they are competing for.

## 2. Consequences

- **2.1** A student found competing in multiple age groups will be Disqualified from any events outside their nominated age group for that carnival (Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics).
- **2.2** A student found competing in multiple age groups in competitions held across more than one day, will be disqualified from the second tournament.

# CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF JUNIOR STUDENTS PARTICPATING IN SENIOR SPORT

#### Weekly Sport – Cricket, Netball, Australian Rules Football, Basketball, Football Senior One Day Tournaments

#### 1. Rationale:

**1.1** When Years 11 and 12 students would be unable to play due to lack of numbers in their year levels **1.2** If a number of Years 11 and 12 students could not play due to illness

**1.3** When a number of Years 11 and 12 students could not play due to other school or external commitments **1.4** When a Years 11 and 12 students could not play because of demands made by their sporting club

- 2. Eligibility Criteria/Rules: No student below Year 10 can participate in any Senior Sports Competitions based on the following criteria: (\*\*with the exception of suitable Year 9 students competing in Senior Cricket)
  - 2.1 Year 10 students need to be competitive against older students
  - 2.2 The selection of the Year 10 student must help the development of the player
  - 2.3 The Year 10 student must improve the team performance
  - 2.4 This situation does not apply to Premier League (with exception of the agreement made by the SACCSS Inc. Committee and Antonine College that Year 7 and 8 students will compete in Year 8 Premier League and Year 9 and 10 will compete in Year 10 Premier League.
  - **2.5** The minimum number of students required to start a game must be made of senior students, the remaining members of the squad maybe from Year 10.
  - 2.6 Student must be currently enrolled in the SACCSS member College they are competing for

#### 3. Consequence for breaches of this Rule:

#### 3.1 Playing an ineligible player in a Home and Away match

3.1.1 the offending team will lose the match in which the breach took place and receive a further match point penalty in accordance with sport ladder point scheme. Furthermore, a 0 score will be recorded for the offending team. The oppositions score will stand.

#### 3.2 Playing an ineligible player in a Final

3.2.1 game lost on forfeit for offending team and opposition awarded the win.
